



Matěj Forman

He was born as one of twins in 1964 in Prague to the family of actress Věra Křesadlová and director Miloš Forman.

After high school studies and a year's experience as an assistant in Jiří Trnka's Studio of Animated Film, he was accepted to the Academy of Arts in Prague to the film and television graphics studio. During his six-year studies at VŠUP, he also completed a one-year course at Columbia University in New York - studio of graphic techniques. In the eighties, he started performing in the summer months with his brother Petr and small puppet shows at the "Theatre Pilgrimages" in Prague on Střelecká island. Together with his brother and several other friends, they later founded the Forman Brothers Theater - a free association of comedians without a permanent stage, traveling on land with their own tent and caravans and on water with the ship Tajemství. He also participates in the projects of the Forman Brothers Theater as an author or co-author of the scene. Matěj Forman accompanied several books for children and adults with his graphics and drawings and is the initiator of scenographic exhibitions "Imaginárium", the common theme of which is the playfulness, inventiveness and poetics of the world of theater and comedy.
